Finally, you should move to the mountains for three years."

After 29 years in the mountains, I can attest, this actually worked for me and my family. Okay, I get it. It's not doable for everyone, but the principle of taking time away truly produces health for our souls and is part of the reason why Yellowstone Alliance Adventures is sought out by thousands of children and adults each year. In the last 15 months we have hired three highly talented individuals who provide energy and expertise in the roles of an Outreach and Ministries Manager, a Rental Group & Day Camp Coordinator, and an Office Administrator. These new team members have elevated the quality of our programs and are enhancing our ability to foster authentic connections and create life-changing experiences.

Recently, when visiting a zoo, Andrea pointed out this quote from Henry David Thoreau that caught her eye and captured my attention. "It is not what you look at that matters, it's what you see." Wow!
